Our staff wants to give you the best service possible...these tips will ensure that!

We have three different trucks (*that all look similar*) servicing your **Garbage, Recycling, and Mixed Compostable** carts. That converts to three trucks traveling down your street at different times on your service day to empty carts.

The time of day your cart is serviced can vary widely week-to-week for these reasons:

- 1. Businesses, snowbirds, and vacation rentals reduce and add service seasonally reducing or increasing our stops per day.
- 2. Traffic during winter is much less than summer, full of additional vehicles due to the tourist season, which affects our travel time.
- Substitute route drivers can come at different times due to illness, vacation schedules, and making up for weather events.

Put carts out by 6AM on your service day to avoid being missed! These guidelines will ensure safe service and prevent interruption:

- Have your cart out by 6:00AM on your service day so you're not missed. If carts aren't out when we come by, there's a fee for us to return.
- Please put four (4) feet of spacing between your carts so our automated arms can access your carts.
- Download our app to receive service alerts regarding break-downs, weather events, etc.

## BEAR CARTS soon

Over the past year, black bears have recently been hitting garbage carts in the Newport area. After working with Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife and the City of Newport, Thompson's Sanitary will soon have bear-resistant garbage cans at a special rate available in 64 and 96 gallon sizes.

Fed bears can become a significant human safety issue, so we need everyone's help to prevent providing a "bear buffet" in your yard. When bears know there's a food source, they will return over and over and become more aggressive about finding food.



Bear-resistant carts are meant to be a "temporary fix" during bear season and these measures are most effective:

- Keep all garbage inside your house, closed garage, or shed and only place it outside the morning of your service day.
- If bears have previously ransacked garbage cans, clean carts with hot water and bleach or ammonia to remove odors.
- Do not feed your pets outside. Keep all pet food and livestock feed inside the house or garage. Remove all food attractants. Don't leave food unattended. Bears are creatures of habit and will return to spots where they have previously found food.
- Clean up barbecue grills and store them inside your garage or enclosure.
- Use three strands of low-cost electric fencing as an easy way to deter bears from chicken coops, compost piles, fruit trees, beehives and garbage cans.
- Use a hand held air-horn to safely scare off bears.
