Twenty years and two children later, they established Thompson's Sanitary Service out of their home on SE 4th Street, just above the bayfront. Agnes did the books out of their office located in the pantry and Kenny manned the one truck they

parked in the driveway of their home. It stayed that way, albeit adding a few more



trucks and staff, for another 16 years before purchasing property on Hwy 20 (now the site of the new Allen Brown Tire Center) where later a new office and truck barn were built. In 1983, Bob and his wife Sandi Thompson purchased the business and the second generation owners began.

The company moved from handwritten bills to computergenerated dot matrix bills in the 1980's and relocated to 7450 Avery Street St. in 2004. In 2007, Ken Riley and Rob Thompson (sons of Bob & Sandi) purchased the business from their parents, began automated services, and are still operating the business today.

In the last 16 years, Thompson's

seen their biggest challenges and changes but excellent customer service remains top priority. Now operating 12 collection trucks, including 3 long haul trucks, hauling all waste for disposal and recycling outside the county, and employing 32 staff, we celebrate our 60-year roots as a TSS family.

Here's our favorite homemade trap to rid your kitchen of these pesky insects. **You will need:** Mason jar, paper, apple cider vinegar (1/2 cup), dish soap, and bonus: a piece of overripe fruit. **Directions:** heat up

apple cider vinegar until it's fragrant and pour into jar. Add a drop or two of dish soap. Roll up paper to make a funnel (secure with tape) and place in jar.
