Lithium Batteries

Lithium batteries can become a severe fire danger when damaged

Today, a wide range of electronic devices (computers, smart phones, toys, e-scooters, landscape tools, calculators, etc) have lithium batteries. These batteries have revolutionized our portable devices and have been proven safe for their intended uses. However, just as glass has a risk of creating shards if damaged, lithium batteries pose a risk of fire if they become damaged.

Lithium batteries can become damaged during the standard collection, transportation, and sorting processes. Both locally and nationally there is an uptick in fires which damage equipment and facilities.

Two years ago, on a Sunday, we had a significant fire in one of our trailers at the Agate Beach Transfer Station. If it wasn't for an employee who happened to be driving near our office and noticed smoke coming from the area, and then a quick responding Newport Fire Department, we could have experienced much more property loss. Please self-haul lithium batteries and electronic devices (as well as all



other batteries) to our **FREE battery and E-cycles drop-offs** at the Newport Recycling Center, 7450 NE Avery, Newport - OR - a satellite battery drop-off at the Newport Library, 35 NW Nye St, Newport. The batteries and E-cycles are both then recycled in responsible end markets.

Never put these items into your garbage or recycling roll cart:

- x Lithium Batteries
- x Rechargeables
- x Button Batteries
- x Smart Phones
- x Power Packs
- x Laptops/Tablets

Paint Recycling

Recycle your old paint for FREE through the Paintcare program

Oregon is one of many states who has a paint stewardship law. That means it's required that a fee be applied to the price of architectural paint sold in Oregon. Retail stores must pass the fee on to consumers. That fee pays for Paintcare to facilitate paint recycling statewide. Thompson's, as well as Sherwin Williams and ReStore in Newport, are Paintcare drop-off sites. All paints must be dropped off in original containers. That includes Interior and exterior architectural paints, deck coatings, primers, sealers, and stains. See our website for a complete listing.

To celebrate Earth Day, Thompson's hosted its 8th annual compost giveaway Saturday, April 22nd. We were thrilled to be joined by the Lincoln County

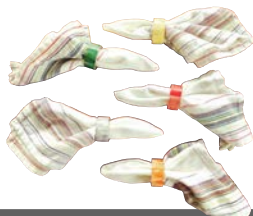
Master Gardeners who were on hand to answer questions, provide pamphlets, and general gardening advice for this community event. In less than two hours, we gave out the two semi-loads of finished compost we hauled in from Pacific Region Compost (PRC), just north of Corvallis. This is the same facility we haul Newport's curbside mixed compostables waste to and within a 70-day process PRC turns it into nutrient-rich compost. One of the best ways to reduce our carbon footprint is to grow our own food and plant native plants and trees, as well as reduce greenhouse gases by making compost from food scraps and yard waste. It's a win-win for the environment!



Napkin Swap

The average American produces 4.5 pounds of waste per day. Staggering, yes? To reduce that, think about what your household could do. Swapping out paper with cloth napkins is one way. To reduce washes and your work load, assign a different napkin ring to each person in your family to reuse throughout the week. In the long run, these will cost less too!
