Oregon's Recycling Modernization & Plastic Pollution Act began July 1, 2025



New Items Can Now Be Recycled!

Yes, it's true — some long-awaited additions are finally allowed in your curbside recycling bin:

Plastic tubs Plastic resin #1, #2, & #5 like:

- Cottage cheese, yogurt, margarine containers
- Rigid plant pots

Cartons-food and beverage cartons, including:

- Milk, Juice, & Soup cartons
- Shelf-stable liquid packaging



Hooray for progress! These items are now accepted as part of Oregon's updated recycling guidelines. Be sure to check the enclosed Recycling flyer for full details and helpful visuals.

♦ What's No Longer Accepted?

With every step forward, there are a few changes to be aware of:

- Aluminum foil is no longer recyclable
- Single-use aluminum pie pans or baking trays are also no longer accepted

✓ Even though these items will be coming off the curb, you'll have an opportunity to recycle them by early 2027 as a drop-off item at our recycling depot as part of the new recycling law. But don't worry — aluminum/tin cans still can go in your recycle cart!

🦖 Clean & Green

To keep recycling effective and safe for everyone, please rinse out all recyclable items before placing them in your bin. This helps reduce contamination and supports healthier conditions for recycling facility workers.

Following the guidelines of what is allowed in your recycling bin saves natural resources, reduces pollution and creates jobs.

Plastic



Bottles, tubs, buckets, and rigid plant pots

Caps OK if screwed on. All items must be 2 inches by 2 inches or larger.

Metal



Aluminum and steel cans, and scrap metal

Less than 10 pounds and 18 inches.


Cardboard and Cartons



Flattened cardboard, packaging boxes, and food and beverage cartons

Pizza boxes must be empty with no food residue.

Paper



Newspaper, magazines, office paper, paper egg cartons, mail, paperback books, paper bags, and non-metallic gift wrap

No!



No batteries



No bagged recyclables



No foam



No plastic bags or stretchy plastics (store or depot drop-off)



No hoses, cords, or wires
